Fine Arts must have their proper place in the new system of education. Acting on the state or screen, and music, dancing. I mean the Indian varieties of dancing sculpture and the like should be taught in schools and colleges. They must form part of the curricula. Fine Arts make life happy and pleasant. We need not argue that physical training is necessary for youth. The training that we are now giving which is only a couple of hours of drill a week, is neither sustained

nor effective. We have to examine how far the present system of physical education is satisfactory and suggest ways to improve it. Sports should also certainly find its legitimate place in the system.

We are now an independent nation. Military security is the only guarantee of Independence. Our young men and women should be trained for the defence of the country. Military training is now a scientific and varied that both girls and boys

have opportunities of service. Our student population has to be given appropriate military training during the course of their study. This is a democracy. Power is not vested in a few coming under the name of class or caste. So that privilege of serving the country in the battle field or aiding those in the field need not be the monopoly of any class or caste or religion. It shall be the general responsibility of everyone. The myth of martial classes must disappear. It may be possible for you to devise methods of integrating physical and military training. Our aim is to build a strong, healthy and disciplined nation, and this can come about only be the aid of an integrated physical and military training. Could we not also teach the boys and girls the

Indian forms of Dancing as part of physical training ? That would enliven the time spent on the schools and be more purposeful than more drab drill.

I need hardly say that the teachers are the pivot of any educational system. It is therefore necessary to pay a great deal of attention to the training of teachers in order to make the new system of education a success. We must have in mind, not only the quality of the teachers but also the number of teachers that are needed particularly in the lower stages also. It may be financially very difficult to implement this scheme if money alone is allowed to dominate as the motive power for service.
